## **Preface**

Over the last few years, the Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU) has had to deal with more and more cases concerning direct taxation, fundamental freedoms and State aid. This is also due to the fact that the European Commission seems to be increasingly willing to criticise national tax law systems and to initiate infringement procedures against EU Member States. As all these cases are of great interest for academics as well as practitioners, they need to be analysed carefully.

The conference "Recent and Pending Cases at the CJEU on Direct Taxation" took place in Vienna from 16 to 18 November, 2022. A great number of experts on European and international tax law accepted our invitation to attend and took part in the discussions.
